

EMOJI PINATA

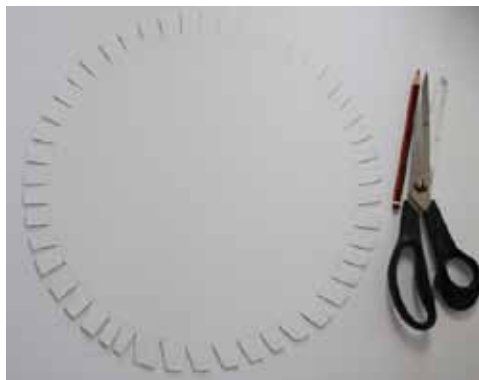


EMOJI PINATA

WHAT YOU NEED

- 1-2 x sheets of thick cardboard
- Small ream of A4 yellow paper
- 2 x A4 sheets of black cardboard
- 15cm flexible wire
- Scissors
- X acto knife
- Ruler
- Cutting mat
- Sticky tape
- Packing tape
- Hot glue gun



Using a circular plate or cake tin as a template, trace 2 x circles onto thick cardboard. Cut out. Measure 2cm from edge around the circumference of the circle and sketch another circle inside the original one. Cut notches around the circle from the outer edge to the smaller circle as pictured.



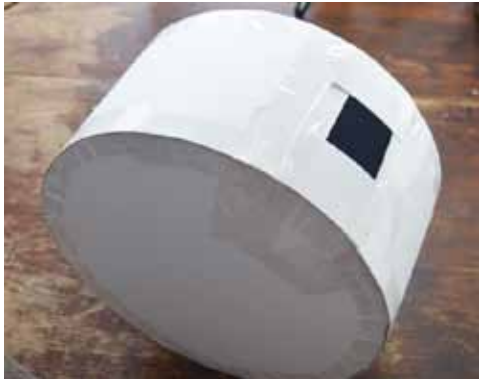
Fold notches in using smaller circle as a guide.



Measure the circumference of the circle now that the notches are folded in. My circle was 97cm circumference, so I cut a rectangle 20cm wide and 82cm long (I took 15cm off the length of the rectangle to leave an opening at the top to put lollies in).



Using packing tape, attach a circle to both sides of the rectangle with the notches inside the rectangle. Don't skip on the tape. There should be a 15cm opening at the top when you are done.



Cut 2 small rectangles out of thick cardboard and tape them to either side of the opening as pictured.



Continue to attach fringing to both circular sides of pinata.



Cut yellow paper into 5cm lengths. Cut a fringe into the strips at 5mm increments. I stacked a few sheets of paper at a time to do this. Use an X-acto knife and ruler for best results.



Use sticky tape, attach one strip of fringing at a time around the rectangular side of pinata as shown. Leave the gap free of fringing.



Print out the emoji-pinata-face templates. Use the templates to cut out faces onto black cardboard.



Use hot glue gun to stick a face to each side of the pinata, with the opening pointing to the top.



Put lollies into pinata before completing the next step.

Use (a lot) sticky tape to secure the cardboard over the opening, cover with yellow fringing.



Now you have finished your emoji pinata.



It's time to party!!!!



Measure the opening at the top and cut out a piece of cardboard that will comfortably cover the hole. Poke the wire through the cardboard and form a loop. Twist the wire a few times and tape generously to secure to the underside of the cardboard.
